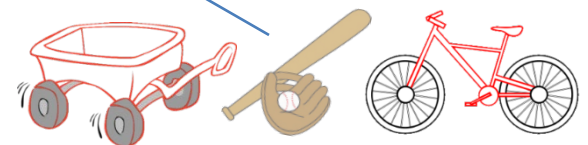

Supplies Needed

(To absolutely rock consigning!)

Tagging is EASY and only a few supplies are needed. Many of these items can be found around your home, picked up at the dollar store or purchased cheaply:

- White/cream Cardstock - 65lb min. (standard paper & colored card stock will not be accepted). Find at Target, Big Lots, Walmart, etc.
- Printer
- Safety pins or tagging gun
- Hangers
- Clear packing tape
- Re-sealable baggies
- String/curling ribbon and/or zip ties
- Hole punch or pen
- Scissor or paper cutter

Prepping & Tagging



This guide is meant for quick reference.

All items must be cleaned thoroughly, with no stains, holes or damage. All parts, pieces and batteries (if applicable) must be included.

Hanging Clothing

Outfits, pants, shirts, pajamas, dresses, coats, bathrobes, dress-up, swimsuits, etc.

Hang items on child-sized hanger, or larger size if clothing is larger. **Hook should always open to the left** (like a “?”).



Attach multiple items (if outfit or set) using safety pins so pieces cannot be separated. Pin to hanger to prevent sagging.

Attach JBF tag on right side of garment (as you face item). If using tagging gun, attach to seam on right side or garment’s tag only.

Accessories/Other Clothing

Onesies, socks, tights, infant mittens, booties, hats, belts, accessories, etc.

Attach sets (i.e. 3 onesies or 6 pair of socks) together with a tagging gun or safety pins. Place in a **clear baggie** and seal with **clear packing tape**. **Attach JBF tag securely** on or inside bag.

Secure tag to loose belts, sunglasses, etc. with string or zip ties. Use safety pin for hats.

Toys *

Use **clear packing tape** to attach tags. Or punch a hole in tag and use string to tie. Put small pieces together into a clear bag and tape securely. For large items, strap together with clear packing tape.

Large Items *

For furniture and infant equipment, **attach tag securely** to item using clear tape if tape will not ruin finish, or hole-punch and tie.

All items must be fully assembled prior to placing onto the sales floor.

Infant Items *

Use **clear packing tape** or **string** to attach tags to items. Multiple pieces? Put into a clear bag and tape to secure.

Multiple Pieces

Items with multiple pieces (i.e. kids art table & chairs), place JBF tag on largest item, then cut out blank tags, write 1 of 3, 2 of 3, etc., consignor # and description, attach to additional pieces.

Shoes

Hole-punch tag and use a **zip-tie** or **string** to secure both shoes and tag together.

For shoes that cannot be zip-tied, place in **clear bag** with tag and seal shut with **clear packing tape**. No shoe boxes.

Books, Puzzles, DVDs & CDs

Use **clear bags**, cling wrap or string to hold multiple items or book set together. Attach tags to bags or cling wrap with **clear packing tape**. Use **scotch** or **painter’s tape** if removing tape/tag will damage item.

Bags, Backpacks & Carriers

Hole-punch tag and tie to item. Zip ties work well to keep bags shut. If high priced, attach to top of hanger using zip ties.
